

CAL/OSHA REQUIRES AN INJURY AND ILLNESS PREVENTION PROGRAM TO HELP KEEP COMPANIES SAFE



Maintaining a safe and healthy workplace provides many benefits to employers and employees. Besides reducing or preventing costly injuries and illnesses, an effective safety and health program can boost employee morale, increase productivity, and reduce costs, including medical treatment, higher worker's compensation insurance premiums, and litigation.

Employers in California have a legal obligation to provide and maintain a safe and healthful workplace according to the California Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1973 and are required to have an effective written Injury and Illness Prevention Program (IIPP). Important elements of a successful IIPP include management commitment, effective communications, compliance assurance, safety inspections and evaluations, accident investigations, corrective measures, safety and health training, and safety recordkeeping.

Training for both supervisors and employees is one of the most important elements of any Injury and Illness Prevention Program.

Ongoing training allows employees to incorporate safety awareness into their jobs based on the unique requirements of the company, reinforces existing safety practices, introduces new safety protocols as needed and makes a company's safety and health program active and dynamic.
